## BOARD MEETING MINUTES: FEBRUARY 10, 2013

February board meeting, held on February 10th @ 7:30 at Norma's house

We started the meeting talking about the upcoming show in March, since that is what our next meeting is focused on preparing for. Robin brought what she got for the club to use to make tile – rock pendants. Kim brought what she got for the club to make drilled stone pendants. Norma ordered tattoo paper for the rock tattoos – that has not arrived but should be in for the show.

We came up with a list of things to do for the February meeting.

First we need to make signs for the new games/crafts, we also came up with the pricing for each one, and they are as follows:

- Make your own Stone Pendants: \$5.00 each
- Duck Pond: 50 cents
- Make your own Tile Pebble Pendants: \$3.00 each
- Rock Tattoos: \$1.00 each

We need to make sure to get the cord gathered for both pendant projects, we also need the glue guns and glue sticks for the tile pendants along with small stones. We decided that at the next meeting we should try this out and make sure this works well, which should be just fine.

We also need to prepare all of the ducks for the duck pond game. We need to attach washers or screws to the heads of all of the ducks. We also need to make a permanent mark on the bottom of the ducks to determine the prize size, large or small. A couple of plastic tubs will be brought to see which size is an appropriate size for the ducks.

Bruce will research non-copyrighted images for us to use and print out examples so that we can use them on the tattoo paper when it arrives.

The good news is the show is full, but we will miss Char as a demonstrator this year.

We talked about the rock shed contract. The hours worked and additional two years on top of that makes our contract last thru March 31st 2022. After that time frame if Kevin R. wants to continue the contract with our club then he may charge if desired up to \$70.00 a month rent. Until that time we have paid up to this date, and do not have to worry about storage for quite some time.

The club received a very nice donation from Larry that we really appreciate. We received a few boxes of very nice raw petrified wood – which we will use for show auctions and bigger prizes when needed. He also donated small pyrite nuggets and chalcopryite in the raw, perfect for raffle & door prizes along with birthday bags. We also may use some of the pyrite for the duck pond game for the larger prizes – the kids would love this.

We talked about the need to make sure new people feel welcome at the meetings, not just to announce but the need to go over and talk to them. So that they don't feel isolated, we need to work on this.

We will be passing around get well cards for Char and Rose Mae at the February meeting for everyone to sign.

We had originally hoped to have a demonstrator come to the March meeting to talk about fluorescents that will need to be delayed. He will still be in Tucson, so now we are hoping he will demonstrate for us during the May meeting. It is not set up yet, but that is the goal.

After much discussion on a topic for the next meeting, we came up with a plan. KevinM will be demonstrating how to make and use a proper screen for screening garnets – since we will be doing a field trip this summer and this will be a needed tool. He not only will show us how to make it, but we will get a hand out to take home so that we can make one too.

The plan for the April meeting is the same, bring a frame we will decorate it with rocks. Perfect for a mother's day gift!

The June meeting Kim will talk about the different industrial uses that rocks & minerals are used for on a daily basis. This should be enlightening for all of us; some will be very surprising.

We talked about the need to do a financial audit – the trustees Kevin and Todd should oversee that in May.

An idea was talked about to see if we can start a side club for jewelry making/ beading. A lot of interest has been shown in the past and maybe we can use some of those creative juices and get to know each other better, in a smaller setting. This would be outside of the club and could rotate to different houses as determined by the members.

We talked about again an idea of having short bio – one person a month added to the newsletter. Kim is coming up with 10 simple questions. She will pick one person to ask these questions to during the next meeting. A picture will be taken and a short bio will be in the next newsletter. After that it will rotate, the person that had the interview will give the next one, so on and so forth. It will help us all to get to know each other better and help us all talk to each other more, instead of always just the same people that we may be comfortable with.

Bruce is also going to do a Facebook page for the club along with a group email/Gmail so that it is easier to distribute messages. He will also be adding a vendor list to the website for the vendor's participating in the March show. This is always appreciated by the vendors due to the additional advertising.

Robin is working on getting all of the accounting set up online; this will also make it much easier for any future treasurer's. Just a password is needed and can be changed if necessary and information will not be misplaced in the changeover times.

We plan on updating and editing the bylaws as much of it is outdated, but this will have to wait until after the show is finished.

We all enjoyed Chocolate cake that Kevin made and a drawing for rock prizes, for the members that were at the board meeting.

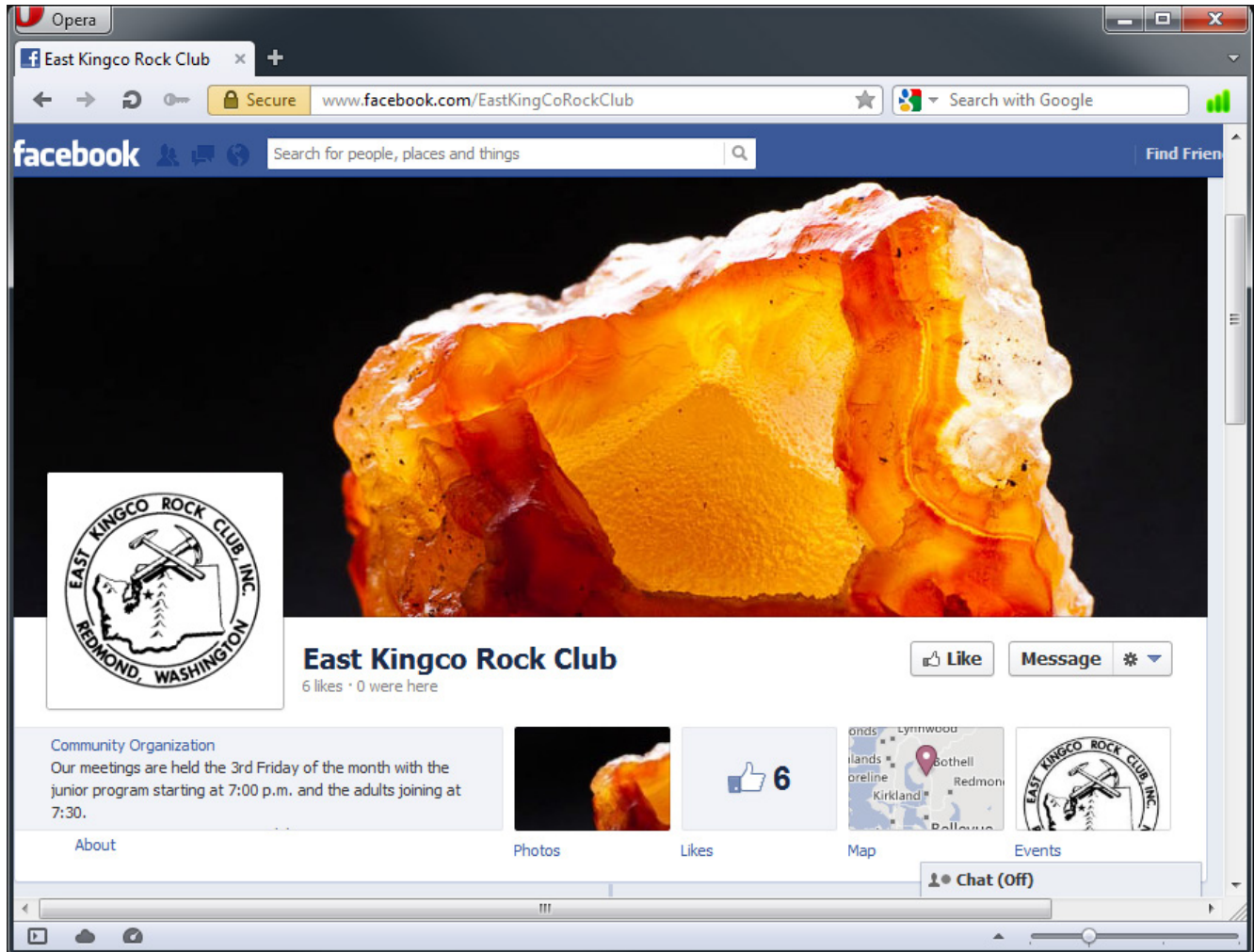
### COMING SOON... EAST KINGCO EMAIL LIST: BRUCE KELLEY
